THE LIBRARY

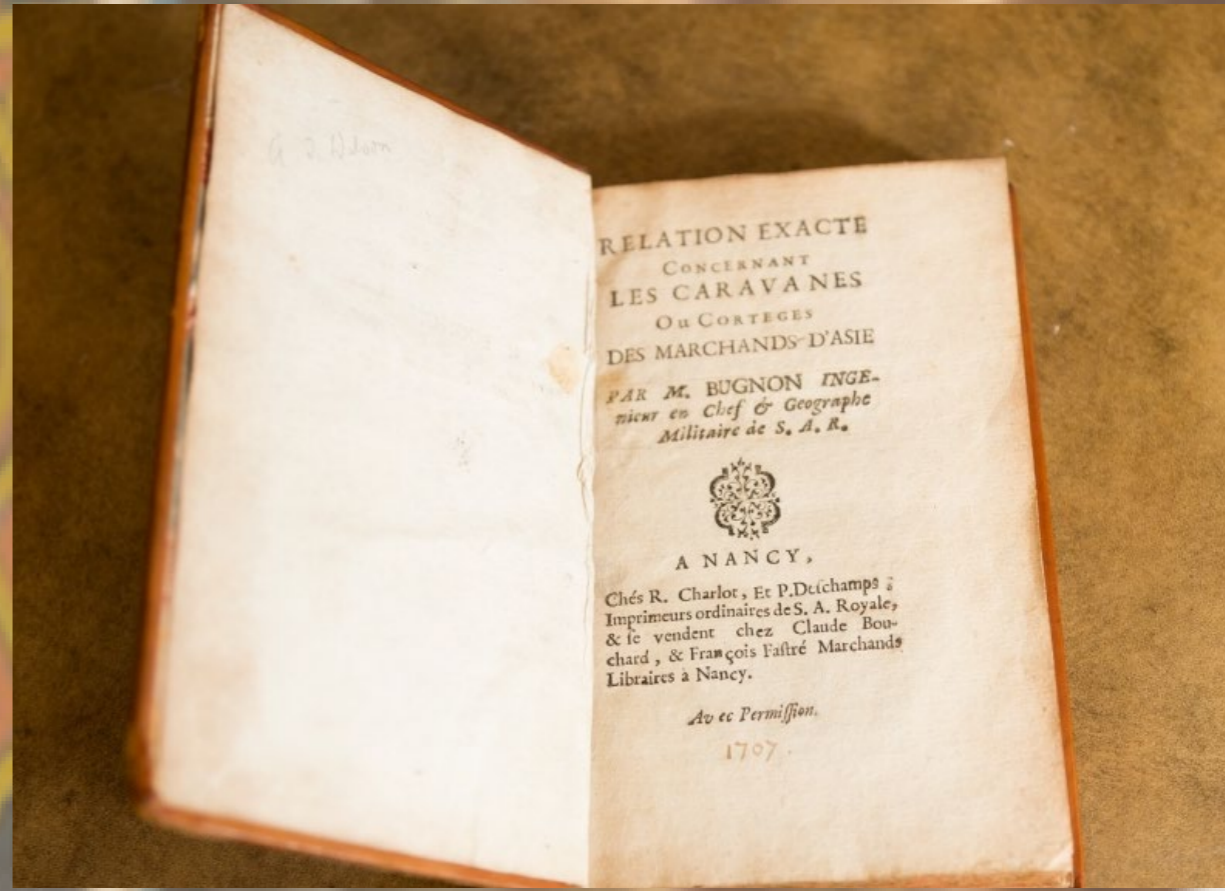
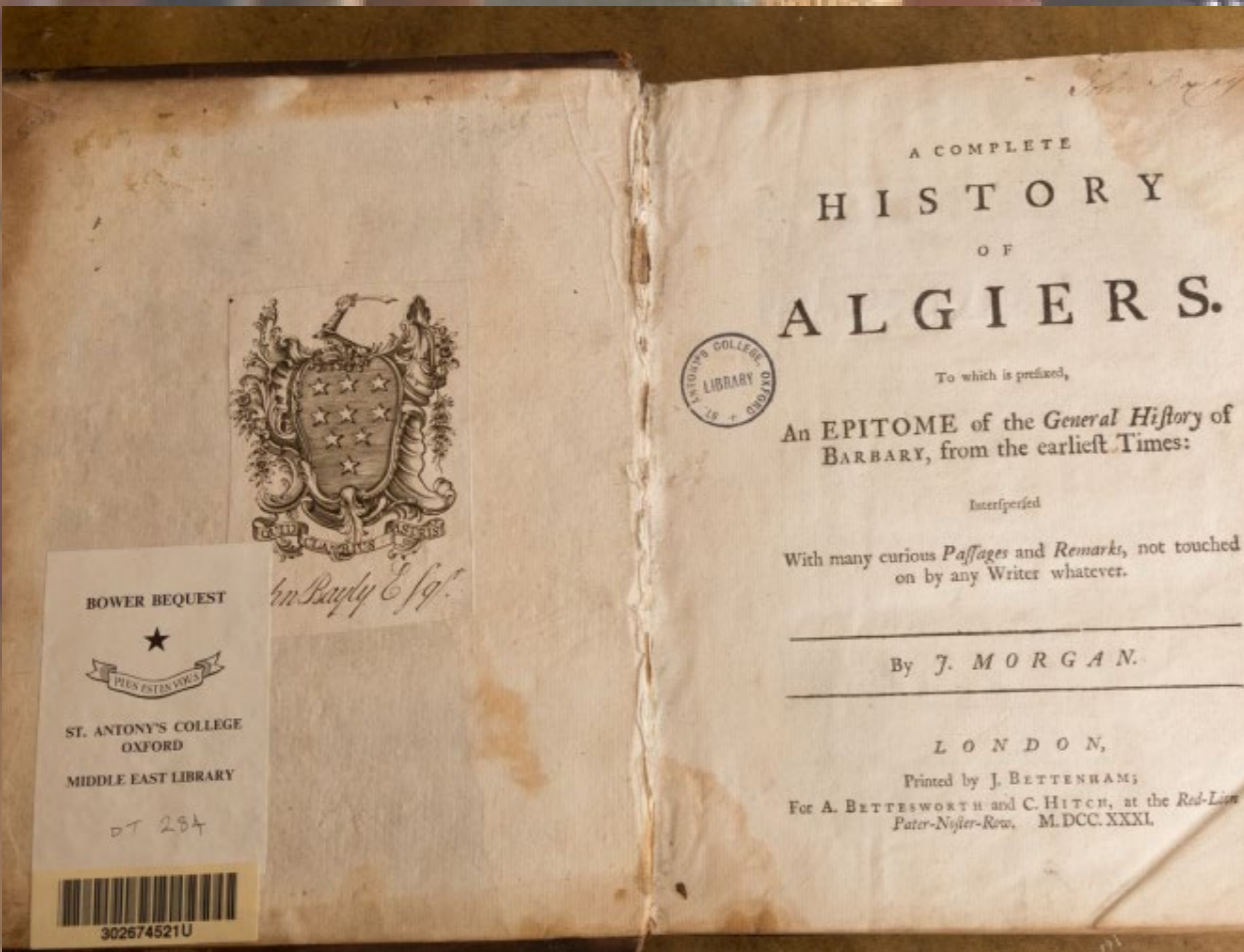
40,000 volumes in European and Middle Eastern languages covering the Middle East

The Middle East Centre provides supervision, teaching and research support for masters and doctoral students in modern Middle Eastern studies.

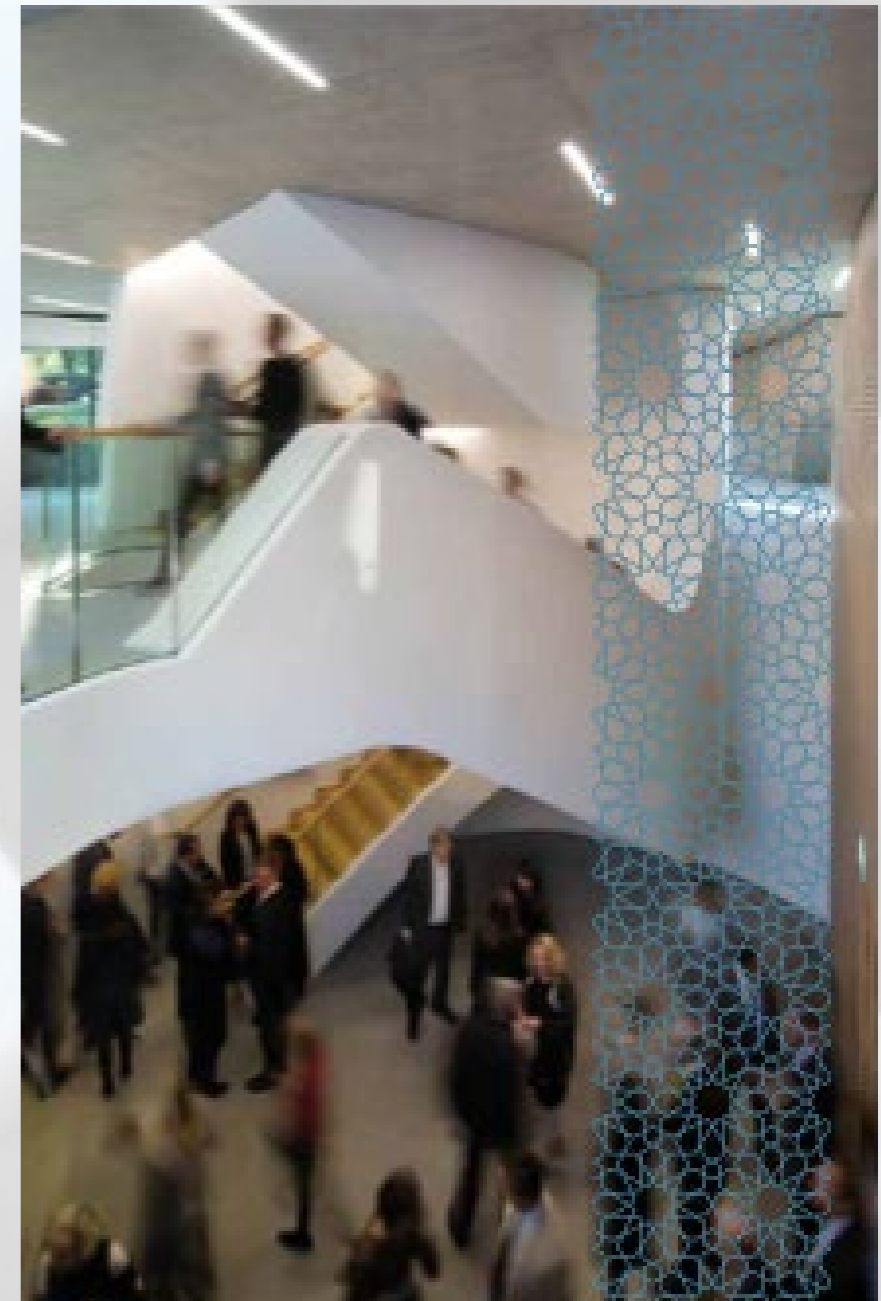
Students come from around the world – from Britain and the rest of Europe, from all parts of the Middle East and Asia, and from the Americas.

The Middle East Centre provides a public forum for debate and discussion on the modern Middle East.

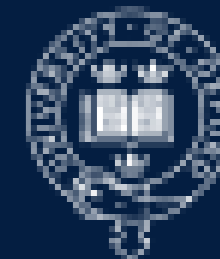
