Importance of Documenting Recorded Sound

"The general lack of appreciation of the evidentiary value of textual elements on commercial phonograph discs by the archives profession goes against the grain of how music researchers look at a phonograph record. They see not only a document of the performance but also a document that contains textual information that augments their understanding of the performance, the performer, and the company that made the record."-Robert Pruter, "Words and Music," p. 58-59

...And Preserving Recorded Sound

Dr. Eric Ederer describes recordings as "difficult to find in their original format and reissued largely with poorly done transfers."

He also suggests they can be used to map changes over time, particularly as counternarrative to musical nationalism





Assembled one of the largest and most diverse 78 rpm collections

25 Edison cylinders; 9,000 78rpm discs; 2,100 photos (1860–1960) of traditional musicians with their instruments; and 130 sound recording trade catalogs!
