



Created when?

- Oil crisis 1973,1979
- 1980 : foundation created

- 1987 : opening to the public
- 2017: 30th anniversary

France & 22 Arab countries


- Dual governance

- Develop & enhance knowledge, study and comprehension of the Arab world, specially its languages, history, cultural and spiritual values
- Facilitate thought and dialogue between French and Arabs
- Contribute to the improvement of the relations between France, Europe & the Arab world

The library in its context

At the opening, 1987

- Main AWI's department
- A reference library dedicated to the Arab world
- all subjects; wide range of Arabic books (20% to 50%)
- Free access to all
- bi-alphabetical ILS Search in Arabic

In the 2000s...

- New documentary context
- Document Management
 System outdated
- Decreased users' entries
- New services requested by users


Document processing in Sudoc Network (2014-2018)





The Digital Library : the heritage collections

- AWI / Bibalex Partnership
- Heritage collections
 (mostly published before 1914)
- 1172 Books / 2030 volumes
- 70 Abstracts/offprints
- 19 Periodicals / 442 volumes
- 45% in Arabic
- 55% in Western languages
- 96% free access


