

Anthology of Arabic and Hebrew Poetry, Yemen, 18th ct.

Meir Rabbinowitz bought the manuscript in Africa from a Yemeni traveler before gifting it to a Dr. Isaacs in Manchester in 1871

Acquisition for the Berlin Library in 1884 from the Frankfurt based dealer Isaak Kauffmann

The library archive / acquisition documents





- Files are preserved for most of the major acquisitions in the Library Archive and the Prussian State Archive (GStA)
- Important source to understand negotiations, market situation and development of prices
- Contain expert reports by librarians and orientalists
- Correspondence between seller, library and ministry

Johann Gottfried Wetzstein (1815–1905)





- Student of Heinrich Leberecht Fleischer in Leipzig
- Interest in Arabic language and Biblical history
- Prussian Consul in Damascus between 1849 and 1862
- Sold Arabic manuscripts to German libraries

Details on local agents in Damascus



Wetzstein in his report from 1851 about the MSS market in Damascus:

"The learned Muhammadan sees with deep pain the only means of teaching himself and his children in the ancient humanities disappear under his hands."

Maḥmūd Ḥamza, Mufti of Damascus, according to Wetzstein:


"What can men do against the power of money?"

Wetzstein on Aḥmad "al-Jamal" al-Miṣrī:

"Aḥmad visited me regularly after dark. For each book he offered to me, he received one piaster. In this way, I secured the right of first refusal. To prevent the same book from being offered to me more than once, I put a black stamp on all the books I have seen."










- Data on the acquisition of about 10.000 mss. with the shelfmarks "Ms. or."
- Period 1828 1945
- 100-s of orientalists and booksellers

Oskar Rescher (1883–1972)





- Lived in Istanbul continuously from 1925 on
- Worked as Cataloger and assistent in bookshops
- Conveyed the sale of 1000-s of MSS to European and American libraries
- Berlin: 1176 MSS


- Rescher sold and donated mss. also to Heidelberg, Leipzig, Tübingen, Halle

- The Portal with descriptions of Islamic MSS from more than 20 collections makes relations visible


Manuscript Notes in Qalamos / Seals












- Qalamos makes about 5.000 notes of owners, buyers, readers [...] in Islamic mss. searchable
