




Overview

Acquiring, cataloging, and processing Arabic, Turkish, Kurdish, Armenian, English, and French materials from over 22 countries.

Materials include monographs, serials, newspapers, & non-commercial materials in traditional and non-traditional formats.


Sahrawi books published in Algeria

Reduction in Number of Copies










